1. Can I choose my residence hall?

Students provide their preferences for housing type (apartment style, suite style, traditional corridor style), not specific residence halls. Last year's NUin cohort was placed into 39 different residence halls.

Housing by the Numbers

- Historically NUin students are placed into 39 different residence halls.
- Over 85% of NUin students are placed into their top housing style choice or with a requested roommate.
- On average 10% of NUin students are placed in apartment style housing, 85% in semi-private suites, and 5% in traditional first-year halls.
- Of those placed in apartment style housing, 50% are in Standard or Economy rate buildings, and 50% are in Enhanced rate buildings.
- Resident Assistant to student ratio is 1:40 across campus.

We will review all preference forms in enrollment deposit date order and do our best to accommodate all requests based on availability.

Living in University Housing

- Undergraduates who enter as first-year students through fall admission and NUin are required to live in university housing during their first and second years, unless a global or co-op experience takes them outside of the city of Boston.
- NUin students will complete the online housing preference form during October and November.
- Roommate requests are permitted through the housing preference form.
- All Gender Housing is offered to students of every class year and can be requested in the online preference form.
- Students who require certain housing accommodations for a medical reason should register with the Disability Resource Center at Northeastern as well as with GEO for your NUin Site.
